## Q&A with Jenny McLachlan



This month we have been lucky enough to chat with Jenny McLachlan, the author of "Dragon Riders of Roar" our Book of the Month.

What made you decide to return to Roar? Did you miss it or was it always a planned book?

I always planned to write four books, I like Arthur and Rose to always explore a new part of Roar so I knew that they wouldn't be going to one of their old haunts. That's why I created the Dragonlands and Dragon Rider Academy. I wanted Roar to keep getting bigger, better and more exciting for readers (and for Arthur and Rose).

Roar has brought us some terrifyingly brilliant villains! How do you create them? (and do they scare you?)

I like my villains to be properly scary. When I was little I read books with truly terrifying villains like Captain Hook, the White Witch and Mrs Trunchbull so I knew that I wanted to create characters who similarly gave readers the shivers. Crowky definitely scared me because I have a bit of a scarecrow fear!

The Roar books are loved as read alouds in classrooms and bedrooms across the country - how do you ensure that your book becomes something that families and classes will all enjoy together?



It's very important to me that my books hold the attention of children. If adults like them too that's an added bonus. Generally speaking I think that children love action and dialogue and start to turn off when the writer indulges in too much description. So I try to always keep my audience in mind!
