

Primary School Sports Premium Statement

The government has provided additional funding of £150 million per annum since September 2013 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. For this academic year, 2017 – 2018, the funding has been significantly increased. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore schools can only use it to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport. The funding is based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. This academic year schools with 17 or more eligible pupils will receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil.

Focus on improving learning and teaching of PE at Howley Grange:

- Stuart How of Your Sport, a highly qualified sports coach, has worked with us to improve and implement our outdoor PE curriculum. He has a wide range of knowledge and experience with school sport and PE and has assisted us to identify our strengths and areas for development and provide us with feedback on how to improve our best practice. We are dedicated to developing innovative and sustainable sports education, which will help our pupils live a healthy, fun and active lifestyle, and to providing further opportunities for those children who display a specific talent or gift. Stuart has introduced new and different sports to our school.
- Our curriculum is progressive and developmental, in order to address the requirements of the new Primary Physical Education 2014 Curriculum
- The least active pupils are encouraged to enjoy PE lessons and activities to facilitate their opportunities to develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels of which they are capable
- Your Sport also provide 3 lunchtime play leaders, to work alongside our traditional lunchtime supervisors, to ensure well-structured playground games during lunchtimes.
- All Your Sport coaches are talented and committed athletes in various sports, are ambitious for themselves and for our pupils, and lead by example.

Measuring the impact of Sports Premium Spending

Activities and provision are carefully planned for and evaluated by S How and SLT, who monitor the impact on the pupils in a variety of ways including:

- Evidence arising from observations of learning taking place in lessons
- Pupil voice opportunities: discussions with pupils about the activities they have undertaken, their experience of teaching and learning in P.E., their participation in matches, tournaments and competitions and their enjoyment of being active
- Discussions about teaching and learning with teachers and coaches
- The feedback regarding health and well-being from School Health
- Achievements in sports matches and competitions, both individual and teams
- Participation at all levels during curriculum times, breaktimes and holidays
- Gaining Gold Award – Sainsburys Schools Gamesmark.

- Lunchtime Playleaders to organise activities and games of all descriptions in the playground, both for younger and older children, to encourage all children to get moving and enjoy a positive lunchtime session
- PE / sports equipment specifically for use at lunchtimes
- Cyber Coach used regularly across all year groups, particularly to warm up at the beginning of a lesson – it offers a wide range of dance and exercise sessions streamed directly to the interactive whiteboard in the classroom or hall
- After school cricket and football coaching provided by an outside sports coach
- Minibus and driver provision to transport children and staff to local and regional matches and competitions.
